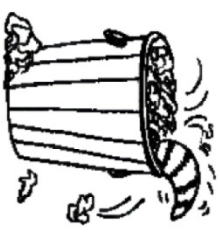


STOP RABIES!



Protect Your Pets and Home!

- Vaccinate your pets and keep vaccinations up to date.
- Stay away from animals you don't know. Report stray animals to your local animal control office.
- Don't touch, keep, or feed wild animals.
- Don't attract wild animals—keep trash can lids on tight.
- Don't leave pet food outside.
- Cap chimneys and seal places animals can hide.
- If you have bats inside your home, call your local animal control office.



If You Are Bitten:

- Wash the wound thoroughly with soap and water.
- Go to the doctor because treatment may be needed.
- Report the bite to the proper authorities such as your area animal control office.



If Your Pet Is Bitten:

- Put gloves on before touching your pet. Be careful, injured pets may bite.
- Call your veterinarian or your area animal control office. Your pet must have a booster rabies shot within 72 hours if it is exposed to an animal that is rabid or could be rabid.
